Through our community partnership with Sustainable Coastlines, dedicated volunteers successfully cleared over 2000 lbs of debris from two Pālolo/ Mānoa stream locations and the surrounding neighborhoods of Kaimukī and Pālolo Valley, covering an impressive 141 acres of land.
