Thank you to all who supported our school and shopped at our Book Fair last week! Next book fair will be at our school craft fair in December!



LIFE CYCLE OF MEALWORMS

Animals experience a variety of life cycles depending upon the animal species, but all cycles include the vital steps of being born, growing, developing, reproducing, and dying. Insects undergo complete metamorphosis or incomplete metamorphosis. Complete metamorphosis means the organism goes through four stages: egg, larva, pupa, and adult. Incomplete metamorphosis means the insect goes through only three stages: egg, nymph, and adult. A nymph looks just like a miniature adult. Check out our 3rd graders learning about mealworms and their lifecycle!!
